During this coming summer of 2012, Gochen Tulku Sang-ngag Rinpoche, assisted by several Tibetan and Bhutanese Khenpos and many volunteers will fill and place one thousand stupas in a month of work, prayer and consecration ceremonies. **Your help is requested to collect some of the many substances needed to fill the stupas.** The stupas of the garden will be filled and consecrated with strict adherence to the texts of the Nyingma tradition, and will contain many sacred substances as well as prayers, mandalas, srogshings, the six levels of worldly wealth and the life force substances. Offerings will be divided among the one thousand stupas and permanently sealed. The positive potentiality of each stupa is immeasurable.

### **Requested Elements to be Instilled in the One Thousand Stupas**

It is of great importance that these substances be gathered and offered with the purest of motivation and positive dedication for the benefit of all beings.

Respectfully harvest the following with prayers for permission to take only a small portion from the earth in each area. Leaves and petals need to be plucked from the stem and thoroughly dried before sending.

Lavender

Medicinal herbs – our interdependent connection; to cure disease and plague  
Flowers – to revive the riches of the earth which have been depleted; to further the earth's gifts of flowers, fruit and food

Sage

Cedar

Sandalwood

Juniper

Seeds – sesame and culinary seeds; those from flowers, edible and medicinal plants and trees (These must be grown with no poisons and harvested very gently, preceded by prayers to the earth for permission to harvest slowly, taking only a few from each area.)

As with:

Grains – to pacify famine

Corn

Millet

Wheat

Barley

Rice

Fabrics – five color brocades, silks, cotton cloth

Water and Minerals – gathered with purist intention and prayer from pure places such as high mountains, pristine valleys, holy places (of any faith), big rivers (Flathead, Amazon, Mekong, Ganges, Nile, etc.) and from ancient lakes; includes small interesting rocks, pebbles and sand.
